Can you and your family afford to risk the future of the NHS?

Under Labour, the NHS now has 89,000 more nurses and 44,000 doctors than 10 years ago. Hospital waiting lists are at their lowest level since records began and over three-quarters of GP practices now offer extended opening hours. Over 99 per cent of suspected cancer patients are now seen by a specialist within two weeks of being referred by their GP. And more than 99 per cent start their treatment within a month of diagnosis.

The Labour Party has now pledged to go even further through a new NHS guarantee of cancer diagnosis within one week of referral by your GP, allowing patients to be tested and told their results in just seven days. Experts say that up to 10,000 lives could be saved as a result.

Alongside this, Labour is promising more personalised care, in the form of free one-to-one nursing for all cancer patients in their own homes over the next five years. This will be delivered through a partnership with Macmillan Cancer Support.

Did you know that these Labour Party guarantees would be scrapped on day one of a Cameron government? And, can you be sure that a vote for your local Liberal Democrat candidate would secure these services for you and your family?

In Hornsey and Wood Green the Liberal Democrats campaigned against the superb new PolyClinic on the old Hornsey Hospital site. Nationally, the Tories have said they will scrap Labour's two-week cancer referral guarantee; the 18-week treatment guarantee; and the four-hour A&E waiting time guarantee. The Liberal Democrats have also said they will scrap these access targets and have talked of 'savage cuts' to the public sector.
